

PROFESSIONAL BIO

Gregory Burge earned his Bachelor's degree in Economics and Political Science from Florida State University in 2000. Having been awarded a University Presidential Research Fellowship, he entered the Ph.D. program in Economics later that year. During 2004, he was awarded competitive dissertation fellowships from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy. He also earned various University and Departmental awards, most notably the DeVoe L. Moore Dissertation Fellowship. He held the DeVoe Moore Postdoctoral Research Fellow position following the conferral of his Ph.D. in December of 2005. Since fall 2006, he has served as an assistant professor of Economics at the University of Oklahoma.

Burge's research activities to date have mostly focused on the topics of impact fees and other local governmental revenue sources. His work on impact fees has been published in the *Journal of Urban Economics*, *Regional Science and Urban Economics*, *Housing Policy Debate*, *Journal of Regional Science*, and several edited volumes including a recent book published by the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy. His work on other topics related to local revenue and housing economics has been published in the *National Tax Journal*, *Real Estate Economics*, and *Regional Science and Urban Economics*. He has also been awarded the David C. Lincoln Research Fellowship.

His professional interests are reflected in his current and previous research endeavors; Gregory is an applied microeconomist with interest in urban and public economic issues. While much of his work has focused on impact fees, he is also interested in the effects of other forms of land-use regulation and the tradeoffs local governments face when implementing growth management strategies. He is also interested in tax policy (particularly state and local) more broadly, and Federal Housing Policies, and is an active member of the National Tax Association and the American Real Estate and Urban Economics Association.
